Dress Code

To help present a competent image and foster public confidence, employees must dress appropriately for their work assignment. In addition, we have high expectations for our students' dress and would expect our employees to dress in line with what we expect of our students. Supervisors/managers will discuss inappropriate dress with individual employees.

Smart Business Casual Dress

In compliance with this expectation, the following are examples of unacceptable attire:

- torn, patched/faded or see through clothing
- halter tops
- tube tops
- tank tops
- jeans
- muscle shirts
- sundresses
- shorts
- shirts with slogans or large-letter advertising
- sweat suits/warm-up suits, sweat pants
- thong type sandals
- showing tattoos/multiple piercings
